Convenient needle up/down button


Press the button to raise the needle to its highest position or lower it. Pressing the button twice sews one stitch.

Flat bed for various sewing styles

The flat bed of the machine lets you sew in various styles. Removing the flat bed attachment allows for free-arm sewing, making it easier to sew tubular items such as sleeve cuffs and trouser legs. You can also sew like a professional dressmaker using a wide table (optional ACC) that helps you work with bulky fabrics.

01 Fuss-free threading

Easy-to-understand graphics on the machine are numbered to easily guide beginners and long-time users alike. No more confusion! Diagrams on the machine help with machine threading, bobbin installation, how to wind bobbins, as well as the handling of thread guides and thread directions that tends to be done incorrectly.



The indications for machine threading start with the direction from the spool. Bobbin winding is also indicated with numbers.

02 Easy needle threading

Thread the needle with one push of a lever! Guide the thread, and then press down on the lever and voilà!

This easy feature works for anyone. Even when you need to frequently change the thread to match the fabric, such as when sewing patchwork, you will no longer be inconvenienced.



Helpful navigation up to needle threading.



Lower the presser foot. Make sure that the needle is raised.



Press the lever!




Easily sew items with frequent thread colour changes.



Bobbin installation is also indicated with arrows.

03 Super sewing quality

With the improved feed dogs and longer J-foot as well as the extra powerful needle penetration, stitches are smooth and consistent on thin and thick fabrics.



04 Sharp feed dogs

Sharp feed dogs are compatible with a variety of fabrics, from heavyweight fabrics such as denim and canvas to lightweight fabrics such as georgette and organdy as well as stretch fabrics such as jersey and T-shirt fabric.



05 High-quality zigzag stitching

Haloing (upper thread looping) is prevented with a brush hidden at the back of the needle plate. This makes for great quality zigzag stitching.

The presser foot locking pin keeps the presser foot level. Smoothly sew even thick seams.



Cleanly sew the overlapping sections of denim and canvas with the outstanding penetration power.




Change the hem length of your jeans. Small amendments to bulky items are easy.

Use denim sewing thread with needles #14 to #16 for a professional finish.





2 Fold over the top and bottom of the pocket and stitch.




3 Sew on the lamé tape with a zigzag stitch. Sew on three pieces equally spaced.







- Medium weighit canvas (82 cm wide × 108 cm)
- Sequin tape (4 to 5 mm wide × 95 cm)
- Lamé tape (4 to 5 mm wide × 70 cm)
- Strap for handles (4 cm wide × 3 m)




4 Stitch the opening of the body, and then sew on the pocket.



5 Place the strap for the handles over the sides of the pocket, and then stitch along the inside and outside of the strap.

Zigzag stitch


Sew X-shaped reinforcements at the openings of the body. After all other stitching is finished, sew the ends of the strap together with a zigzag stitch.




6 Fold in half with right sides together, and then stitch along both sides.



Stitch the gussets. Open the opening to the front and back, and then fold the bottom corner to form a triangle. Sew straight stitching perpendicular to the seam so that the stitching has a width of 25 cm.



8 Turn right side out, and then sew overlapping stitching at the opening to reinforce the side seams.



Sew back and forth 2 to 3 times.



CREATION Neatly sew lightweight fabrics.

Some people tend to shy away from lightweight fabrics which are thought to be difficult to sew. However, the Innov-is A Series can neatly finish elegant, fashionable clothes made from lightweight fabric.

Get straight to sewing a variety of fabrics, such as georgette or organdy, to make party dresses or children's clothes for events. Going out in unique garments is no longer just a dream!



Sew a variety of fabrics without adjusting the presser foot pressure.



For delicate fabrics like organdy, install a needle and thread for lightweight fabrics.

Use thread for lightweight fabrics with needles #9 to #11.

Sleeveless top made of lightweight fabric


- . If there are no instructions to use a specific stitch, use the straight stitch. Presser foot "J" (straight stitch) will be used.




Let's make a sleeveless top from lightweight fabric. Wear this top together with the skirt as a gorgeous party set.



• Cotton voile (60 cm square) - 3 pieces




Prepare all three pieces by folding back 5 mm twice and stitching along all edges to make 58 cm square handkerchiefs.







Fold all three pieces into triangles.

2 Overlap two pieces, and then sew them together.




Place the third piece at the top of the piece made in step 2 to make a neckband. Sew the third piece onto the piece made in step 2 so that the width of the overlap is 10 cm.





Fold to the inside, and then sew blind hem stitching by hand.



Wear tied around the neck and waist.



Long skirt made of lightweight fabric

- 1. If there are no instructions to use a specific stitch, use the straight stitch
- 2. Presser foot "J" (straight stitch) and overcasting foot "G" will be used




Let's sew a three-tiered long skirt made of lightweight fabric. If you have plenty of fabric, you can sew straight lines to connect square pieces to make fashionable clothes to wear to a party.

Materials


- Cotton voile (120 cm wide × 175 cm)
- Elastic tape (2 cm wide × 65 cm) Prepare a length of the waist size + 2 cm.

120 cm wide




Cut out each piece.
Use the selvage on both ends.




2 Sew overcast stitching along the edges of the pieces that were sewn together.






3 In order to create gathers, machinebaste (straight stitching with a long stitch length) along the top edges of B and C.




Pull both ends of the thread to create gathers.


4 Sew together the pieces.



Adjust the length of the gathered top edge of B to the length of the bottom edge of A, pin them together, and then stitch together.




Adjust the length of the gathered top edge of C to the length of the bottom edge of B, pin them together, and then stitch together.




Fold up the seam allowances, iron them, and then sew them in place by stitching from the right side.

Sew the ends together to form a tube.



6 Fold back twice and stitch at the waist and hem. In order to pass the elastic tape through, leave a 5 cm opening on the side of the waist.



Pass the elastic tape through to complete the project.

Overlap 5 cm of the elastic tape, and then sew together with a stretch stitch.






French-sleeve T-shirt

- 1. If there are no instructions to use a specific stitch, use the straight stitch.
- 2. Presser foot "J" (straight stitch/zigzag stitch) and overcasting foot "G" will be used





Materials


- Jersey fabric (110 cm wide × 125 cm)
 Use fabric that does not have edges that roll up when it is cut.
- · Machine thread for knit fabrics

Cut while adding the seam allowances indicated in O.

There is no seam allowance at the neckline.

Bust size: 75 to 85 cm


First, draw and prepare paper patterns, as shown below.



1 Sew overcast stitching along the body of the front and back.

Sew overcast stitching along the shoulders, sleeves and hem.





With their right sides together, sew together the front and back along the shoulders.

Seam allowance: 1.5 cm




Fold over the sleeve hem, and then sew with an elastic zigzag stitch.





4 Form a ring with the bias tape, and then sew it to the neckline.




Fold over both edges and iron, and then open again. Sew together both ends to form a ring.

Form a ring with a 1 cm seam allowance.

Starting from the center of the back, sew 1 cm from the edge.

Fold the bias tape to the right side, and then sew one line of stitching along the edge.




5 With their right sides together, sew along the sides.



6 Fold over the hem, and then sew with an elastic zigzag stitch.


· Long T-shirt - 1 piece



Use a long T-shirt so at least 12 cm can be cut off. If a short T-shirt is used, make the ruffles with other fabric.



2 Cut three pieces with a width of 3 to 4 cm from the portion used to make ruffles. The original hem will not be used.



Cut C in half to make two pieces. One of those pieces will become D.

Cut the side seams of A and B to make strips.




Use a sewing machine to sew rough straight stitching along the center. Leave excess thread on both ends.




Pull the threads to reduce the length of each strip (A to D).





4 Fold up the hem twice, and then sew with a Stem stitch.






Set up the sewing machine for free-arm sewing, and then sew the ruffles onto the T-shirt.



For details on free-arm sewing, refer to the manual for your sewing machine.





Fold back the fabric at the beginning and end of stitching, and then sew reverse stitches.



Once you better know your sewing machine



In the video, ruffles are made by feeding the fabric with an awl. Gathers can be created by pushing in the fabric in front of the presser foot.





Sew buttonholes.

Buttonholes can be used not only to fasten buttons on clothes and accessories but also as accents on your project as well as for decorative sewing. Automatically sew a buttonhole the size that matches the button.




Attach stabilizer for a neat finish on lightweight and delicate fabrics. Be sure to lower the buttonhole lever.



This mini-bag-type pouch can be used for carrying cosmetics and accessories. Try altering it, for example, by making it larger or orienting it vertically, to fit your needs. Buttonholes that are not cut open can be used as decoration, but here they are useful for securing the pouch with buttons.


Materials

- Outside fabric (tweed, 17 cm wide × 26 cm)
- Lining fabric (cotton/linen, 16.5 cm wide × 25 cm)
- Flap (plain-weave canvas, 13 cm wide × 22 cm)
- Stabilizer (for mediumweight fabrics, 11 cm × 10 cm)
- Decorative buttons (approx. 1.8 cm diameter) – 2 pieces




2 buttons (1.8 cm diameter)


Separately fold A and B in half with their right sides together, and then stitch along each side.



2 Fold over 1 cm at the openings of A and B, and then iron them.




3 Turn A right side out, and then place B inside. Align the side seams, and then pin in place.




4 Sew one line of stitching around the opening of A 5 mm from the edge.



Make the flap. Iron stabilizer to the wrong side of C.



6 Fold in half with right sides together, and then stitch along both sides.



7 Turn right side out, and then sew buttonholes to fit the size of the decorative buttons.




Mark at a 45-degree angle in an area away from the seam allowances.



8 Stitch along the opening and edges.



9 Attach the flap to the body.



10 Sew on the buttons by hand.

Buttoned napkin ring

- 1. If there are no instructions to use a specific stitch, use the straight stitch
- 2. Presser foot "J" (straight stitch) and buttonhole foot "A" will be used




This napkin ring is like a simple buttoned belt. Use fabric in a variety of colors or colorful patterns.

Some models cannot sew characters like those on the napkins.

Materials

- Cotton (26 cm wide × 12 cm)
- Stabilizer (24 cm wide × 5 cm)
- Button (2 cm diameter)

Prepare the required quantities for the expected number of people.

This length is for a 45 cm square napkin. Change the position of the button and the length of the belt to fit your napkin.







- 1. If there are no instructions to use a specific stitch, use the straight stitch.
- 2. Presser foot "J" (straight stitch), overcasting foot "G" and buttonhole foot "A" will be used


- Main fabric (65 cm wide × 21 cm)
- Other fabric (20 cm wide × 21 cm)
- Sheeting (72 cm wide × 20 cm)
- Buttons (2 cm diameter) 2 pieces
- Cotton batting



1 Make a plain cushion with the sheeting.

Fold over 1 cm at the opening, and then iron.



Turn right side out, stuff with cotton batting, and then stitch to close the opening.


2 Sew the edges of the main fabric and other fabric with an overcasting stitch.









3 Sew together the main fabric and other fabric with their right sides together.




4 Sew buttonholes in the folded portion of the other fabric.

6 Turn right side out, sew on buttons, and then insert the plain cushion to complete the project.




Materials



- Cotton fabric (110 cm wide × 55 cm)
- Bias tape (11 mm wide × 130 cm)
- Concealed (invisible) zipper (20 cm)

Cut while adding the seam allowances indicated in O. (There are no seam allowances at the neck opening or armholes.) Size: 90 cm height

First, draw and prepare paper patterns, as shown below.




Sew overcast stitching along the shoulders and sides.




Stitch along the center of the back to the zipper opening.





Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching. Sew on the concealed (invisible) zipper.

Align the end of the zipper with the finished edge.



Attach inside out on the seam allowance of the fabric.



Gather at the front of the neckline. Use a sewing machine to sew rough straight stitching, and then pull both ends of the thread to reduce the section between ★ and ★ to 10 cm.



With their right sides together, sew together the front and back along the shoulders.



6 Cover the neckline with bias tape.

Align the edge at the neck opening.



Open the zipper.



Fold back 1 cm.


Fold over the edges of the center of the back, place the bias tape on the wrong side, and then stitch along the first fold from the top.



Fold the bias tape up, and then fold back 1 cm at the end.




Fold the bias tape in four along the folds, and then stitch the edge of the tape from the right side.



Specialized presser foot can be guided over a concealed zipper - easy enough for anyone to sew neat finishes.



With the zipper foot, zippers can be skillfully inserted. You can also sew vinyl and synthetic leather.



With a specialized presser foot, vinyl and synthetic leather can be smoothly sewn.


Synthetic leather bag

- 1. If there are no instructions to use a specific stitch, use the straight stitch.
- 2. Presser foot "J" (straight stitch) and the Non-Stick Foot F007N (sold separately) will be used



- Synthetic leather (45 cm wide × 100 cm)
- Stabilizer (43 cm wide × 13 cm) 2 pieces
- · Cardstock (circle of 8 cm in diameter)




1 Affix stabilizer to the portions to be folded over.




If the stabilizer cannot be ironed on, affix it with craft adhesive, etc., applied to areas that will not be sewn.


Pold over, and then stitch along the top and bottom and around a circle for the handle opening. (Do the same on both ends.)




3 Cut circles out of the handles.




4 Fold the body in half, and then stitch along the sides.




5 Turn right side out to complete the project.








Sew down the center of the top opening.




- Synthetic leather (circle of 8 cm in diameter) 2 pieces
- · Cord (3 mm thick, 45 cm long)
- Scrap of material for a tag* (2 cm × 4 cm)
- * Any scrap of material, for example, the same fabric or felt, can be used.



Sandwich the knot in the excess scrap material and stitch.



With their right sides out, stack the round pieces of synthetic leather, and then stitch them together. If the material does not feed well, use the separately sold Roller Foot F066 or Non-Stick Foot F007N.



5 Attach the keys.

Pull the cord to store the keys inside the case.



Synthetic leather zippered pouch


- If there are no instructions to use a specific stitch, use the straight stitch
- 2. Presser foot "J" (straight stitch) and zipper foot "I" will be used




Use ostrich print (embossed) synthetic leather. After mastering zipper insertion, you will be able to make high-quality pouches on your own.

Materials

- 20 cm zipper with bead pull 1
- Synthetic leather (23 cm wide × 28 cm)




Attach the zipper.



Use the zipper foot "I" or Narrow Zipper Foot F079 (sold separately) to attach the zipper so that it connects A and B, laying flat. 2 Stitch to form a tube.

Sew the two pieces together from the wrong side.



3 Turn right side out, and then stitch along the seam.


It's easier to sew with the zipper opened.



Fold open the seam allowance and stitch.




4 Turn wrong side out, stitch along both sides, and then turn right side out again.





Done!
The stitching is what makes this project neat.

If clean stitching cannot be achieved, use the Roller Foot F066 (sold separately) or Non-Stick Foot F007N (sold separately) to smoothly feed and beautifully sew synthetic leather.




Zippered convertible apron

- If there are no instructions to use a specific stitch, use the straight stitch
- Presser foot "J" (straight stitch/zigzag stitch), zipper foot "I" (or seperately sold Narrow Zipper Foot F079) will be used.




Materials (Waist size: 60 cm)


- Medium weight canvas (75 cm wide × 90 cm)
- * Waist + 15 cm
- · Open-end zipper (70 cm wide)
- Strap (4.5 cm wide × 90 cm)
- Hook-and-loop fastener (2 cm wide × 5 cm) 1 set
- Button (2 cm diameter)



Prepare the strap.




2 Attach the zipper between A and B. Use the zipper foot "I" or Narrow Zipper Foot F079 (sold separately).



Fold back 1 cm on each edge.


3 Fold back 2.5 cm on the edge, and then sew with a zigzag stitch.





Do the same on the left and right sides of the top and bottom pieces (A and B).

4 Fold over the edge at the waist, and then try it on to determine the position for the hook-and-loop fastener.




5 Attach the belt. Sew on the belt so that it covers the folded end.

Reinforce by stitching back and forth 2 to 3 times.

corner on the left edge.



Attach the belt 2 cm below the top edge.



6 Attach the button to complete the project. Enjoy using the apron while adjusting its length, for example, long when cooking and short when gardening.

Extend your sewing workspace.

The extension table allows you to accommodate larger and bulky projects. Thus, sewing large items, like tablecloths, or bulky items like heavyweight totes, is made easy and comfortable when the extension table (optional) is used.



With a wide table the fabric is kept stable, making it easy to achieve a beautifully sewn finish. Article No.: WT15




This fashionable item can be easily made by simply sewing along the edges of a square piece of fabric. It can be worn as a blouse or a bathing suit cover-up.


• Cotton print (90 cm wide × 280 cm)




With their right sides together, sew together the front and back along the shoulders. Leave a 32 cm opening at the center.




2 Fold back twice and stitch about 5 mm of the seam allowance around the opening.



3 Fold over 5 mm + 1 cm and stitch along all edges.



4 Secure with stitching 12 cm from the top.

Sew accents with decorative stitches such as zigzag and overcast.

Further enhance your design by sewing decorative tape, ribbons, sequin strings, etc., using a zigzag stitch. Equipped with simple and practical stitch patterns such as overcasting, blind hem and appliqué.


We recommend using presser foot "N" and needle #11. Attach backing material for neat finishes when sewing patterns.



Slippers



With right sides out, sew together the sole (felt) and the insole made in step 1 with stitching along the edge and a 1 cm seam allowance.





These slippers are made from thick felt. Three-dimensional items may seem difficult to make, but even beginners can complete the project if they carefully sew according to the instructions. When inserting pins into thick fabric, be careful not to poke your fingers.

Some models may not have functions used for the sample shown in the photo.

Materials

- Fabric for upper and thick felt for sole (65 cm wide × 28 cm)
- Jersey for insole (25 cm wide × 28 cm)
- Stabilizer (25 cm wide × 28 cm)

Draw joining marks with an erasable pen.



Fabric for upper



Stabilizer Cut 1 cm smaller than the pattern.

Flip over the pattern, and then cut it out to make a left and a right slipper.

1 Affix stabilizer to the wrong side of the insole.




